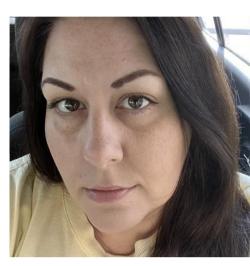
Welcome our New Executive Director, Rebekah Johnson

Free Flowing with a Mobile Practice - Angie Kociolek, Class 28

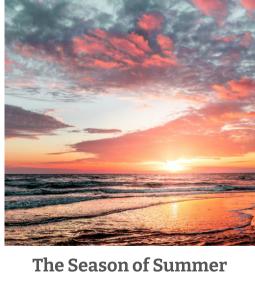
Acupuncture, for me, has always been an expression of my autonomy. What can I say? I like being my own boss.
